Orangeburg Police Arrest Walhalla Man in Internet Predator Sting

Columbia - Attorney General Henry McMaster announced today that Calvin Moore, 41, of 124 Hillsdale Drive in Walhalla, South Carolina, was arrested on March 8, 2010, in an Internet Predator sting conducted by the City of Orangeburg Department of Public Safety.

The Orangeburg Department of Public Safety is a member of the Attorney General's Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force.

Moore was arrested on one (1) count of Criminal Solicitation of a Minor (§16-15-342), a felony offense punishable to ten (10) years imprisonment.

An arrest warrant alleges that beginning on or about October 13, 2009, Moore solicited sex on the Internet from an individual he believed to be a minor girl. In reality, he was soliciting sex from an undercover Orangeburg Police officer.

A search warrant was executed at Moore's residence and resulted in the seizure of one (1) desktop computer, one (1) laptop computer, and two (2) cell phones. The Oconee County Sheriff's Department, also a member of the Task Force, assisted in the case.

Moore was assigned a \$10,000 bond. [A booking photo is available through the Orangeburg-Calhoun Regional County Detention Center.](#)

This is the one hundred eighty-seventh (187th) arrest for the Task Force.

The case will be prosecuted by the Attorney General's Office.

McMaster stressed that all defendants are presumed innocent unless and until they are proven guilty in a court of law.
