Anderson Police Arrest Conway Man in Internet Predator Sting

Columbia - Attorney General Henry McMaster announced today that Norman Lee Beberg, 29, of 1101 Chicora Boulevard in Conway, was arrested on June 6, 2008, in an undercover Internet sting conducted by the City of Anderson Police Department.

The City of Anderson Police Department is a member of the Attorney General's Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force.

Beberg was arrested on two (2) counts of Criminal Solicitation of a Minor (§ 16-15-342), a felony offense punishable to ten (10) years imprisonment on each count.

Arrest warrants allege that beginning in July 2007, Beberg solicited sex on the Internet with an individual he believed to be a thirteen (13) year old girl. In reality, he was communicating with an undercover Anderson police officer.

Search warrants were executed at Beberg's residence, and resulted in the seizure of two (2) tower computers, a digital camera, and computer-related equipment.

The Horry County Sheriff's Office (also a Task Force member) assisted with the arrest and search.

Beberg was assigned a bond of \$25,000. [A booking photo is available through the Anderson City Detention Center.](#)

This is the one hundred twenty-seventh (127th) arrest for the Task Force.

The case will be prosecuted by the Attorney General's Office.

McMaster stressed that all defendants are presumed innocent unless and until they are proven guilty in a court of law.
